### Eirgrid – Powering Up Dublin Project

- Dublin's electricity infrastructure is old and needs to be upgraded to service the future needs of the city and its residents.
- Eirgrid are responsible for maintaining the electricity infrastructure in Ireland, so they are embarking on a major investment project to upgrade the network over the next number of years.
- Phase 1 involves laying 50km of new cables across the city to provide a stronger network.
- This includes establishing links between the key substations in Dublin, one of which is to link Poolbeg with Carrickmines.
- There are different options available on what route will be taken, so members of the GRA Committee have joined an Eirgrid Community Forum to represent the interests of residents.
